Gold	Recognise and order numbers from 0—20. Double numbers up to 10. E.G. Double 2 = 4.





How to support your child in English this term

Read a range of texts with your child, including their school library book. Encourage your child to discuss their library book with you to increase their comprehension. Ask them lots of questions about the characters and events. For example... Why was the boy sad? What made him happy?

Encourage your child to say the first sounds in words e.g. 's' being the first sound in 'sun'.

Provide opportunities for your child to explore different writing materials, e.g. chalk, pencils, crayons and paints.

Things to Practise in Maths this term

Help your child to count up to 20 and back to 0. We'd like everyone in Reception to have at least their Bronze badge by Christmas!

Challenge your child to count as many cars as they can see on their way home from school.

Encourage your child to identify numerals in the environment.


What number can they see on that front door/bus?
