Return your reading folder everyday. Remember you need at least three adult comments a week to earn a book point.

Earning Multiplication Awards in Recep-

Bronze	Count from 0 to 20 and back down to 0 again.
Silver	Say a number that is 1 more or 1 less than a number to 20.



To give your child as many experiences as possible you could visit,

- Centre for life
- Discovery museum

How to support your child in English this term

Read a range of texts with your child, including their school library book. Encourage your child to discuss their library book with you to increase their comprehension. Ask them lots of questions about the characters and events. E.g. Why was the boy sad? What made him happy?

Encourage your child to blend sounds together when reading. E.g. c-a-t cat

Encourage your children to write simple captions and sentences. E.g. The cat.

Don't forget to practice your tricky words on your bookmarks.

Things to Practise in Maths this term

We would like all children to work on numbers one more and one less than a number up to 20. It would lovely to have lots of Silver badges this half term. E.g. one more than 6 is 7. One less than 19 is 18.

Challenge your children to add groups of objects together. E.g. adding fruit in a fruit bowl. There are 5 oranges and 2 apples how many are there all together.

Encourage your child to use everyday language to talk about position. For example- Elsa hid under the table.

Once your child can recognise their numbers to 20 support them to learn their numbers to 30 and beyond...
